

AWARDED PROJECTS

1. FIBER OPTIC TRUNK LINE UPGRADE

Amount Awarded: \$200,000

<u>Performance Period</u>: 11/1/2018 – 4/30/2020 (funding released 5/8/19)

Project Description:

- Replace and upgrade fiber trunk line and network capacity throughout grounds
- Install new conduit and trunk line in Carnival area
- Upgrade network from 1GB to 10GB

Major Benefits:

- Enhance reliability of facility-wide communication system
- Expand network data delivery

Major Items Funded:

- Fiber optic cable
- 10GB network package

2. PUBLIC WARNING SYSTEM UPGRADE

Amount Awarded: \$370,000 (\$142,284 of funding released)

Performance Period: 5/1/2019 - 4/30/2020

Project Description:

Convert Public Warning System to single mode fiber

 Replace non-operable communication equipment at Expo Center, Main Gate, East Gate, and Grandstands

Major Benefits:

Provide more reliable communication facility-wide for emergency alerts

 New sound system will have the capability to be operated remotely from control center in Administration Building

Major Items Funded:

- Outdoor and indoor speakers
- Amplifiers
- Auxiliary equipment
- Microphones
- Wireless control system

3. ACCESS CONTROL SYSTEM UPGRADE

Amount Awarded: \$52,000 (\$16,610 of funding released)

Performance Period: 5/1/2019 - 4/30/2020

Project Description:

- Upgrade outdated access control system for Administration building and vehicle entrance Gate 2 and Gate 25
- Implement more reliable key card entry system

Major Benefits:

- Remotely shut down vehicle entrance gates or Administration building during emergency
- Track individual access with key cards

- Door/gate controllers
- Installation and configuration
